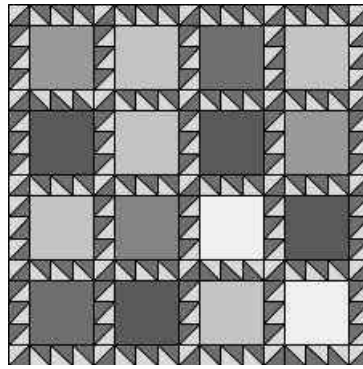



# Scrappy Sawtooth

Unpieced Blocks/Pieced Sashing  
51" x 51" Quilt



HARTFIELD collection

This could be made from 10" Layer Cakes & 5" Charm Squares if you want to trim

You need: 145 Sawtooth Squares finishing to 3"  & 16 unpieced squares finishing to 9"

## Rotary Cutting

The Center Squares – Cut 9-1/2" squares. You need 16.

The sawtooth sashing- Cut 3-7/8" squares. You need 73 light & 73 dark. If you piece before cutting see Fast Piecing below. If you piece after cutting triangles see Conventional Piecing & cut each in half now with a diagonal cut. You need 145 light & 145 dark triangles.

## Piecing the Sawtooth Squares for Sashing & Cornerstones

### Fast Piecing



Draw a diagonal line on the reverse of the light squares with a pencil or waterproof marker. Lay a dark square face to face with a light square. Stitch a line on either side of the pencil line 1/4" away from the pencil on either side. Cut on the pencil line & press open the square. 73 pairs give you 146 sawtooth squares.

### Conventional Piecing

Piece a light triangle to a dark triangle. Press open.



### Assembling the Sashing.

Piece 3 Sawtooth Squares into a strip.

Do not worry too much about orientation or contrast. The charm of these quilts is the wackiness. Make 40 of these sashing strips.

## Setting the Quilt

Make a wide strip alternating 4 large unpieced squares with 5 sashing strips.

Repeat 3 times so you have 4 wide strips.

Make a narrow strip alternating sashing strips with a cornerstone of a single sawtooth square.

You need 4 strips and 5 cornerstones in each narrow strip.

Repeat 4 times so you have 5 narrow strips.

Alternate the wide and narrow strips to make the top.
