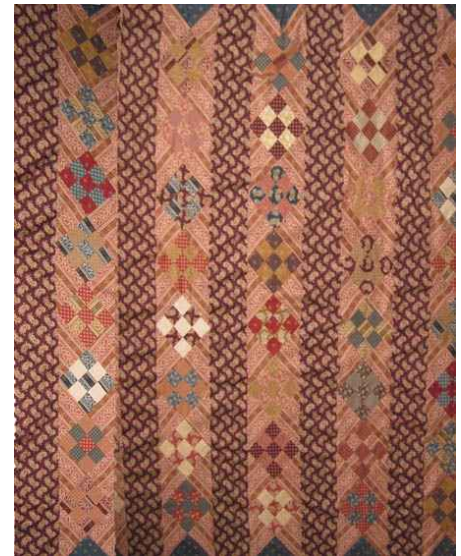




Sorghum Taffy Strip Quilt

77" x 78 1/2"

Blocks= 6" finished Nine Patches
Pieced strips finish to about 8-1/2"
Plain strips finish to 6"

Fabric

For Triangles—2 Yards
For Strips—2 1/3 Yards
For 9-Patch squares— a Jellyroll
2-1/2" strips

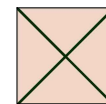


Nine Patches

Cut 9 squares 2-1/2"----5 of one print, 4 of another
(Don't worry about contrast.)
You need: 40 Nine Patches

Setting

For the ends of each strip-10 Half Nine Patches
I just used triangles. Cut 3 squares 9 3/4". Cut each into 4 triangles with 2 cuts.



Striped setting triangles

Cut 45 squares 6-7/8". Cut each in half with a single cut.
You need 90 striped triangles.



You're going to have bias edges along the side of the strips, but that's the only way to get the look.

Setting Strips

Cut 6 strips 6 1/2" x 77".
